# **EXTERNAL PARTNER: CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OF PHILADELPHIA**

This month we are turning the spotlight on Children's Hospital of Philadelphia who just launched a new ECHO Autism series called ECHO Autism @ CHOP: While You Wait which runs from January – June 2023 every 1st and 3rd Thursday, 10:15 – 11:30 AM ET

ECHO Autism: While You Wait is an evidence-based virtual community that allows family members of a child awaiting an autism evaluation or access to developmental services to learn about what they can do while they wait for those appointments. A multidisciplinary group of autism and developmental experts will lead the discussion and encourage family participation with questions, suggestions, and polls.

Topics include: What is Autism? What to Expect During an Autism Evaluation, How to Access Important Services (e.g., early intervention, special education), and Parenting Skills for Children with Developmental Differences.

This series is designed for family members of young children who have not received a diagnosis of autism and are awaiting an autism evaluation, have recently been diagnosed with autism, and are in the process of accessing services and/or have a developmental difference and are in the process of accessing services.

Each 75-minute session includes a presentation from subject matter experts about key topics and best practices for children awaiting an evaluation, an interactive discussion about a clinical case study presented by an ECHO team member, Q&A session with the presenter, and the opportunity to provide recommendations and access to relevant resources to continue families' learning journey and help them support their child.

# SPOTLIGHT ON ECHO AUTISM BEHAVIOR SOLUTIONS IN HOSPITALS

This month we are highlighting ECHO Autism: Behavior Solutions in Hospitals. We will be starting the second round of this series on April 3, 2023.

ECHO Autism: Behavior Solutions aims to bring knowledge of best practice care to healthcare teams in hospital settings.

#### What is ECHO Autism: Behavior Solutions in Hospitals?

ECHO Autism: Behavior Solutions in Hospitals is a virtual learning program intended to improve care for autistic people within the hospital setting. Individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder are known to have increased utilization of emergency room visits and they sometimes require hospitalization. Understanding and meeting their needs can be challenging in these settings, therefore, it is essential the Emergency Departments and Hospital-based Healthcare Teams have the knowledge and training to support patients with autism spectrum disorder effectively.

This program launches with a kickoff training on April 3rd. The program includes six virtual ECHO sessions on Mondays from 1:15pm to 2:30pm CST, beginning on April 10th and going through May 22nd.

Participation in this program is suited for hospital-based healthcare teams including mental healthcare teams and emergency departments. This includes nurses, physicians, social workers, child life specialists, security, psychologists, quality improvement specialists, patient advocates, hospital administration, etc.

This program is spearheaded by an interdisciplinary panel of leading experts in the autism field. The hub team consists of an autistic adult, a clinical psychologist, a child and adolescent psychiatrist, a family advocate, a hospitalist, and a resource specialist.

Participants can expect to learn and share best practices for interfering behaviors, managing medical conditions, including psychiatric conditions, connecting with community resources, and family/caregiver support.


