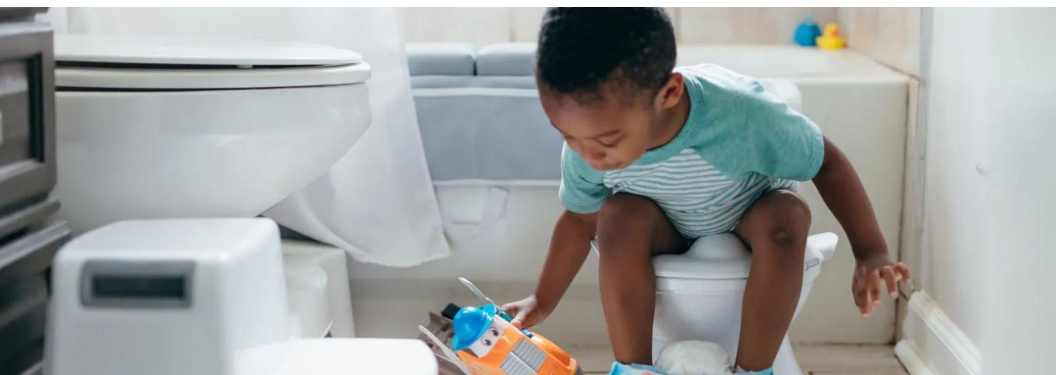


Toilet Training

Brief Informational Guide



Toilet training can be challenging for children on the autism spectrum. There are different reasons why it may take a longer time for autistic children to learn to use the toilet. Many develop the skills at a later age than other children. Each autistic child is different and knowing this can help you find the best ways to meet your child's needs.

Common Areas Affecting Toilet Training

- Medical - Constipation
- Physical - Low Tone
- Language - difficulty understanding language
- Dressing - difficulty pulling pants down or up
- Sensory - afraid of sitting on toilet or hearing toilets flush
- Body Cues- children with ASD may be unaware they need to go
- Need for Sameness- not wanting to use different toilets

Tools For Success

- Getting your child their own toilet (potty seat)
- Timers
- Visual Schedules
- Special Underwear
- Rewards Chart

Did you know?

- Typically, children learn daytime dryness first because it is a more teachable behavior, while nighttime dryness requires a maturity of the brain-body connection.

Quick Points to Practice

- Be supportive
- Immediately provide praise
- Stay calm
- Stick to a schedule
- Use the same words when talking about toileting. (e.g. potty vs toilet)

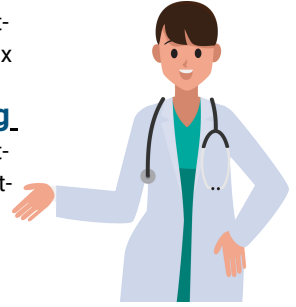
