

The **Missouri Division of Developmental Disabilities (DD)** was established to support the unique needs of individuals, family members, and caregivers who experience a developmental disability. This support focuses on empowering individuals with disabilities to have quality opportunities and choices to be fully included in the community.

How can someone access DD services?

Missouri Developmental Disability services are accessed through the **Regional Office** or **County Board** in which the person who experiences disability lives.

What does the Regional Office/County Board do?

- Conduct an interview and assessment to determine eligibility for DD services
- Once eligibility is determined, a referral to a Support Coordinator or Information Specialist will be made.
- Support Coordinators/Information
 Specialists will assist individuals and their
 families access local, regional, and State
 resources to meet needs related to their
 disability.

What are the differences between a Support Coordinator and an Information Specialist?

Support Coordinators:

- Provide Targeted Case Management (TCM) and work with individuals, families, and other professional team members to develop and implement an Individualized Service Plan (ISP)
- Connect individuals and families with resources and services in the community that help meet identified needs.
- Once services are in place, assist with ongoing monitoring of the effectiveness of the supports.

Information Specialists:

- · Assist with Medicaid enrollment
- Offer information on specific disabilityrelated topics.
