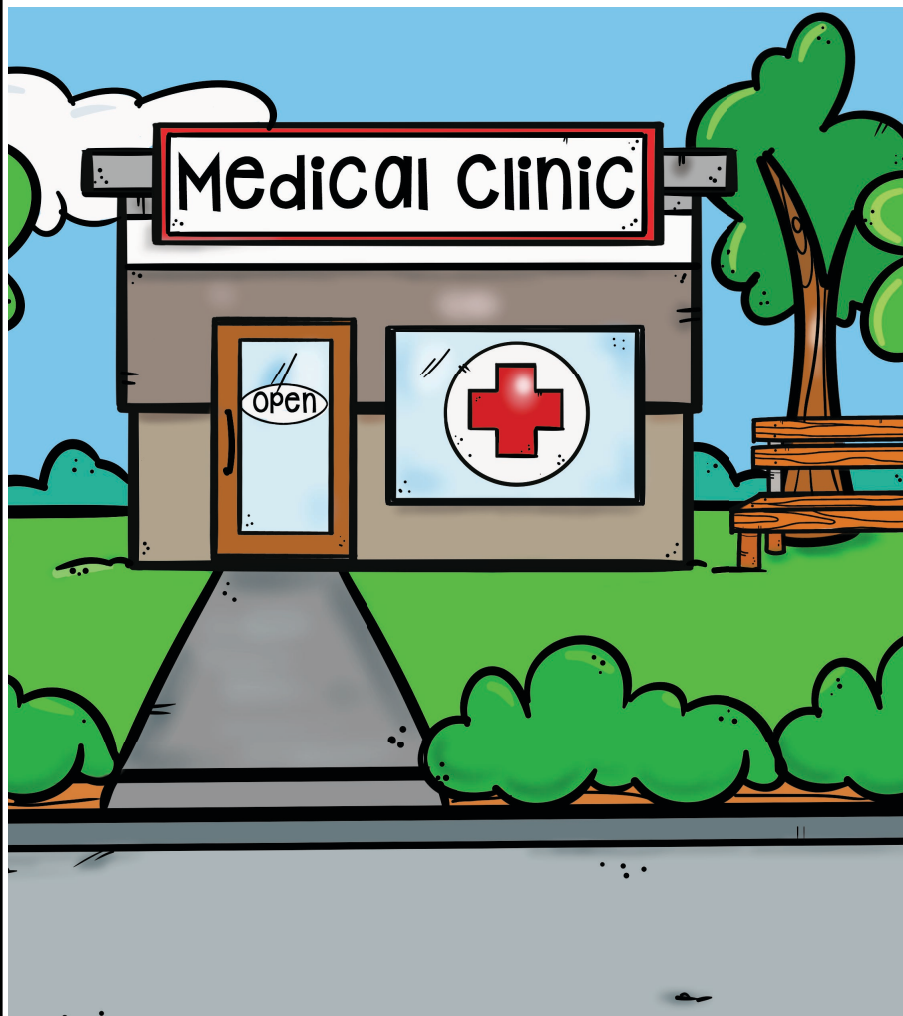


GOING TO THE DOCTOR

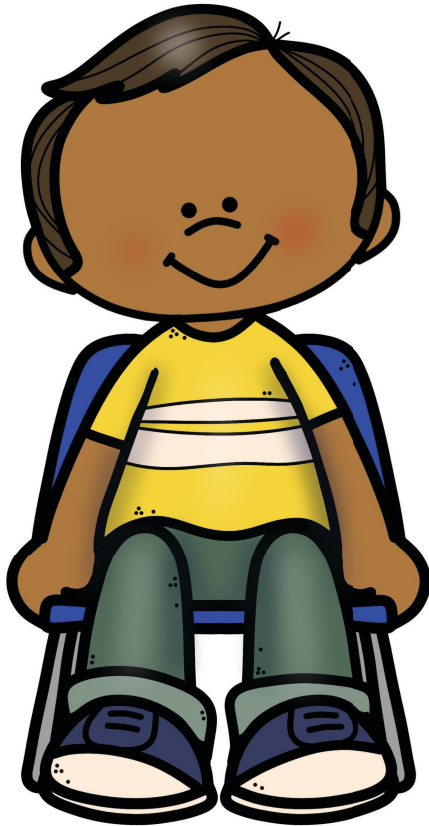


First, we drive to the

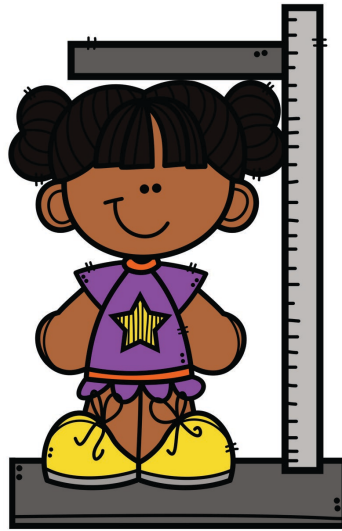
Then, we walk inside to

while we wait.



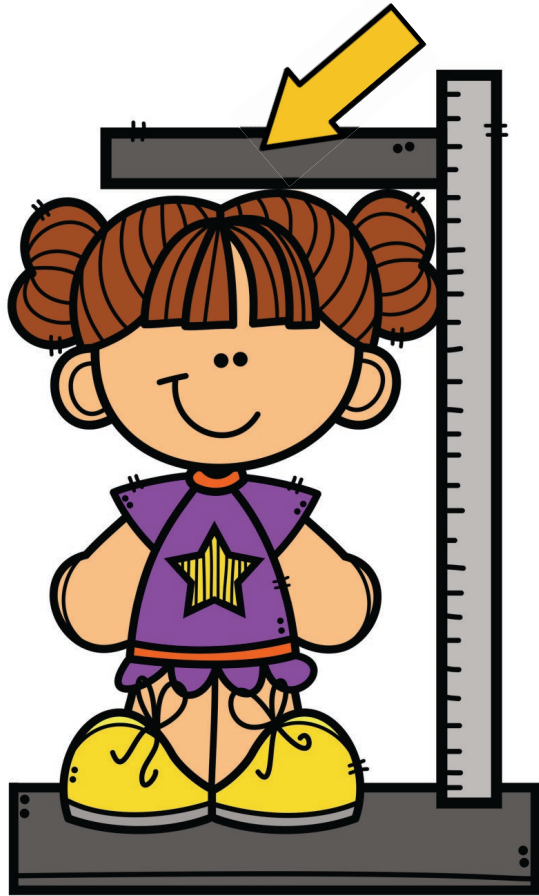
When it is my turn to see the

back to a small room



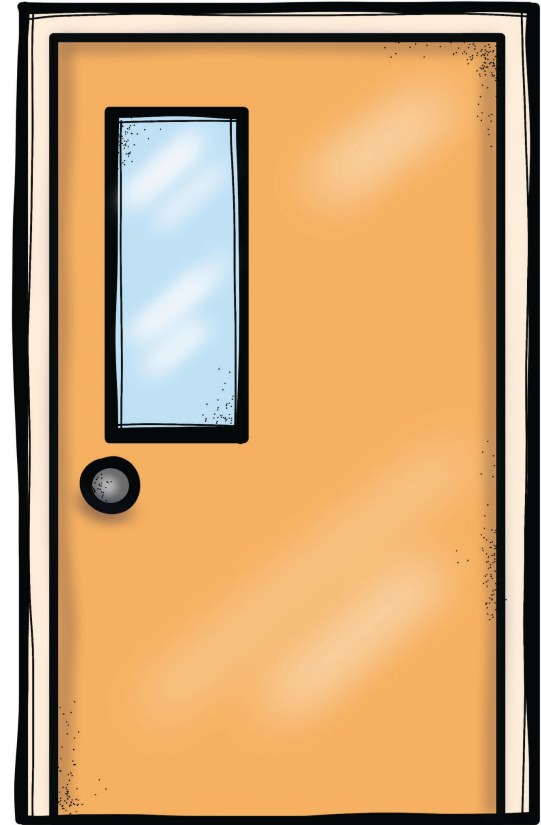
We might stop to get weighed and measured first.



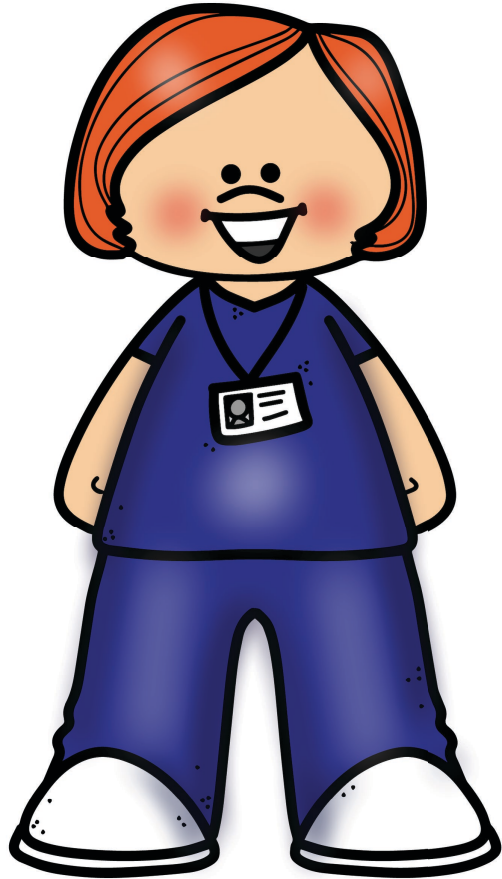
When I get weighed, I step on the scale and count to 10.



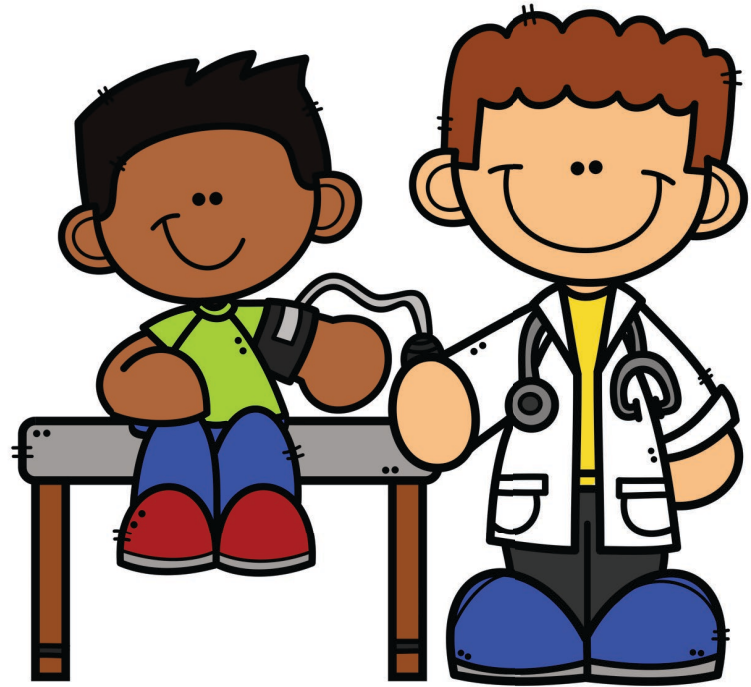
Then, the nurse will measure

and my mom or dad.



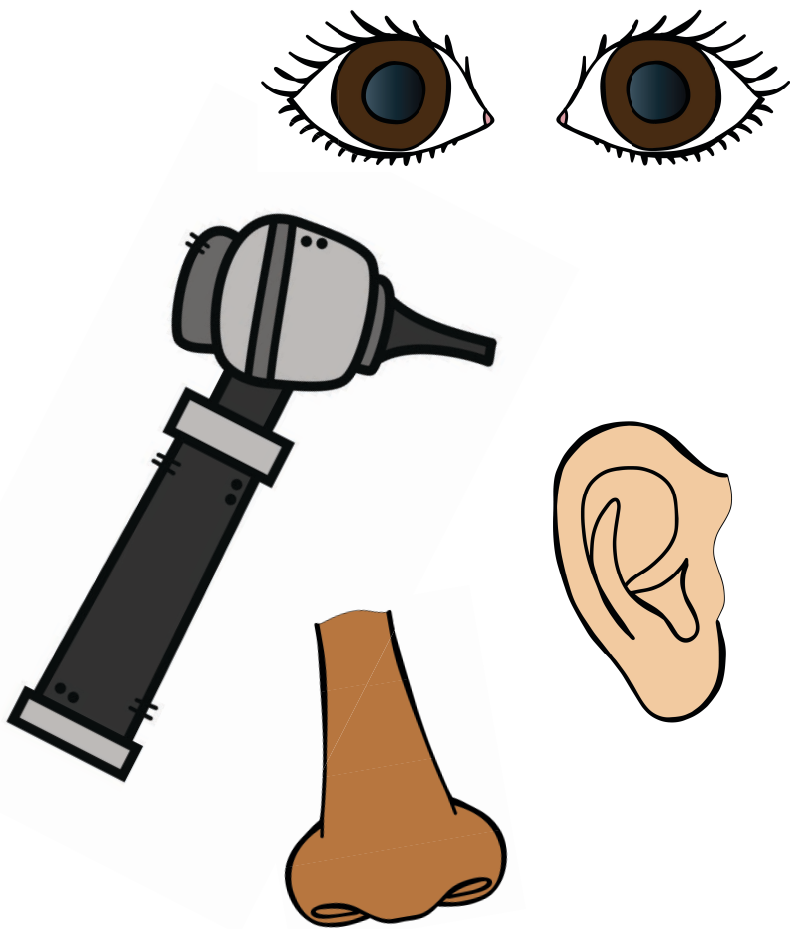
The nurse might take

and talk to us.



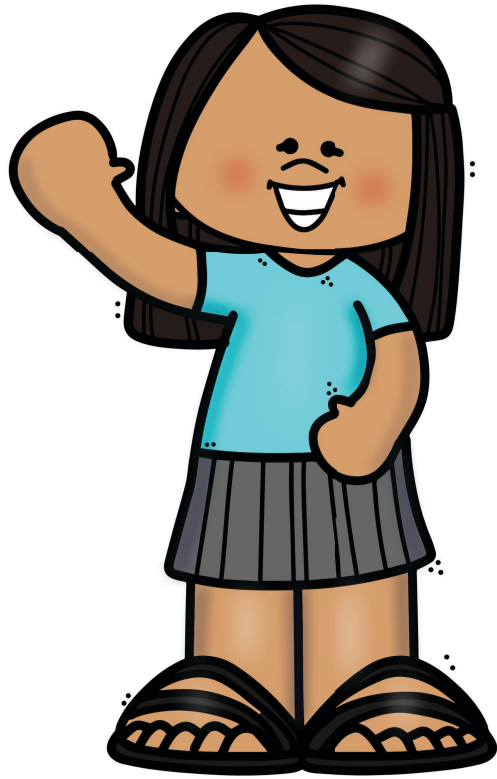
The doctor might listen to

This won't hurt either.



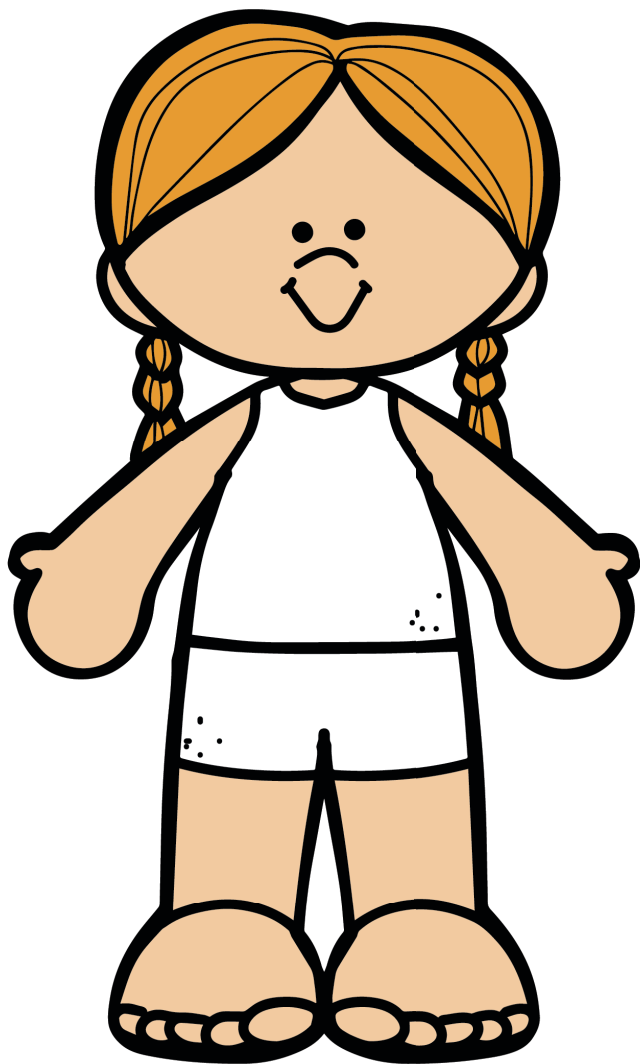
Sometimes, the doctor will

tongue to look in my mouth.



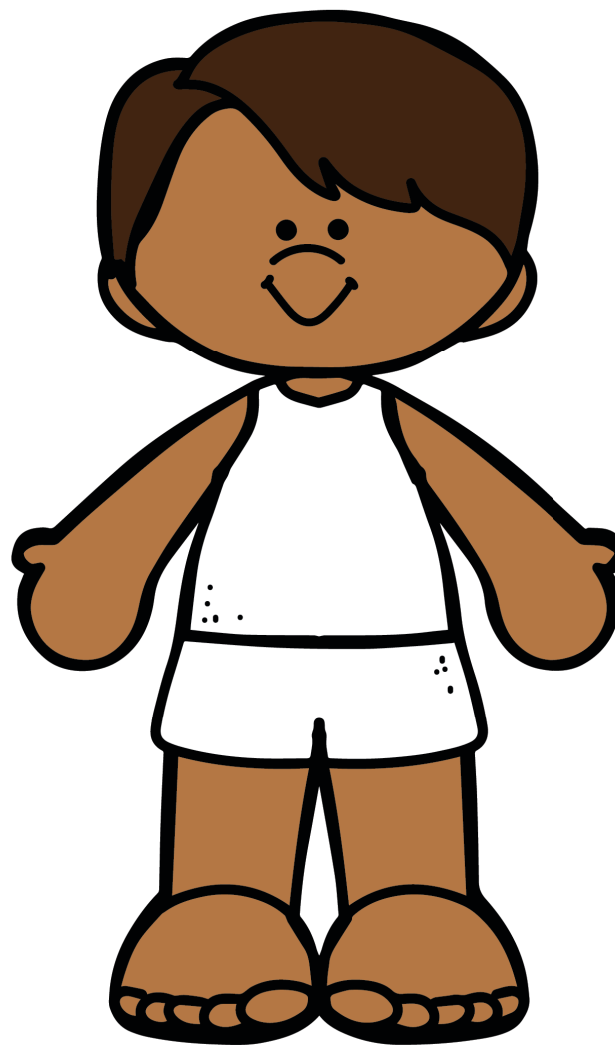
When the doctor is all done
